Tech. Session

Why: Dyno testing an XPAG/XPEG engine

Thanks: To the Southeastern MG T Register for inviting members of the Peachtree MG Registry to share in their Tech. Session and providing lunch to all attendees.



Anybody who attended the T club's show at Hiawassee in the Fall may remember that Don Harmer had problems with his T car, eventually having it towed back to Atlanta. The engine, which had 30,000 miles on it since its last re-build was taken out of the car and Bob Wagner at Atlanta Imported Auto Parts started to dismantle the engine. The head gasket had failed between the #2 & #3 cylinders, a freeze plug had moved from its seat, the cam showed that the surface had started to disintegrate and the lifters were bad.

Having rebuilt the engine and replacing the points with a Pertronix Ignitor ignition system it was set up on the Stuska Dyno and was checked over for oil and water leaks. Before the session the engine had run for approx 4 hours at around 2,500 to 3,000 rpm. The other equipment used was a Sun 1120 Electronic Testing Machine. One interesting point is that both of these machines were circa 1960's and to the delight of Bob did not contain any computers!

The engine was started and allowed to run for approx 15 minutes at 1500 rpm, after this time it was decided that the engine had warmed up sufficiently to allow the full dyno. test to proceed. Ear plugs were handed out for those who required them, the rpm's were increased the engine noise increased the rpm's were maxed out at just over 5500, it was run for about 45 seconds at that level then shut down.

The outcome of the test showed that at 5500 rpm the engine produced 70 bhp, as regards to the torque, the Stuska Dyno showed that at between 3,000 rpm & 5,000 rpm the engine was producing 65.5 ft lbs with a max. of 73.5 ft lbs at 3,000 rpm & 3,500.

The Registry again would like to thank the T club and Bob Wagner who made it a most enjoyable and educational session.

I was going to say at the same time next year but the Christmas advertising and holiday decorations always seem to start a little earlier each year and if my calculations are correct we should start getting our pre holiday notices of the upcoming Christmas season some time shortly after the fourth of July. In my opinion Christmas is for kids and what the **Peachtree Registry** did for the Empty Stocking Fund as a result of the Christmas party is tremendous. That to me shows the real Christmas spirit. Most of the bidders paid way over the value of what they were biding on because they knew the proceeds were going to a great cause. I personally paid \$35 for a ten-dollar model car. Mind you this is not the first time I paid way over what a car was worth but this is the first time I did it on purpose and will admit to it.

We went to Florida for the holidays like we always do and when we were there we get a chance to visit with some of the friends we made when we lived there. One in particular is a friend of mine that lives in Sarasota. I met him through another friend who lives in Orlando that knows him from going to college with his brother. Ralph, my Sarasota friend, is an accomplished automobile painter but that doesn't describe him very acutely. He is more an artist that does body and paint work. The work he does is remarkable and to see him do it, it looks so easy that it is not hard to think that you can do the same thing, but after you try you see how skilled he is. He has a wonderful reputation and attracts the people who have some of the finest automobiles on the west coast of Florida when they need his

services. Show cars and one of a kind classics are always at his place. I told Ralph many years ago that my favorite car of all times, after MGB of course, is the 1936 Auburn boat tail speedster. All those years ago Ralph told me that he has done some work on one that is owned by a Doctor in Sarasota. I asked him at the time if there was any way we could get the Doctor to show me the car. Ralph told me no problem just let him know the next time I was going to be around and he would arrange it. Over the next couple of years schedules never worked out and I was never any closer to seeing the car. I had never seen a real speedster. I have seen zillions of pictures and many replicas of the speedster and even the modified version of the speedster that Madonna, who played Breathless Mahoney, used in "Dick Tracy" but never the real thing.



A few days before we were getting ready to start our drive south to our place on Anna Maria Island FI. I got an Email from my friend in Orlando stating only " Ralph has the Speedster at his house" with this message were two photos of the car taken with a cell phone camera. I tried to called Ralph but as usual no answer so I called my friend in Orlando and asked him how long Ralph was going to have Speedster because we were going to be down there soon and I, of course, wanted to see it. My friend told me that Ralph was expecting me and he was holding the car waiting for me to show up. The owner had brought the car out to Ralph about nine months earlier to get some work on one of the fenders and Ralph still had it. Ralph painted my Mercedes for me some time ago and I learned you can get an excellent job or you can get a fast job but not both and the better you want it the longer it takes. Ralph's job on the Auburn was to keep it original. No bondo, no lead, and exactly the right kind of paint. He told me when I was there that the paint shops that can mix the kind of paint they used in the thirties is getting harder and harder all the time and he has branched out to over one hundred mile in his search to provide the kind of finishes that his clientele require.

With all the anticipation of a six year old on Christmas morning I drove over to Ralph's house early Saturday morning and there it was sitting in his yard, my version of the Holy Grail, A 1936 Auburn Speedster. It was even more beautiful than I had imagined. Gleaming silver gray paint, a red pin stripe, red leather upholstery, and red spoke wheels with wide white wall tires, what a majestic lady.
